Chairman's Report

A Rocha South Africa, has, like everyone, this last year being re-thinking, adjusting, slowing down, speeding up, amending our operations in the light of the Covid pandemic that was and is the substantive item for 2020. We are grateful to God for His sustaining and protecting hand through the pandemic. As a Christian, biodiversity, conservation organisation we rest in His hands and look to Him to sustain and guide us. (Col 1:9-10). We see God's hand in helping and preparing us "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (Eph 2: 10)

A major organisational item concluded in October 2020 was the A Rocha family signing a new Covenant which will govern the way the international organisation will be run. It has created a Board with Worldwide Regional Representatives and the ARI Board Trustee for Africa is Prof. Alfred Oteng-Yeboah (A Rocha Ghana). Dr Simon Stuart is steering the organisation as the new ARI Executive Director.

In October/November 2020 the Trustees did a mid-term review of our 2019-2023 strategic action document per region. Our regional Action Plans have been updated for 2021-2023 to look at an amended plan based on the global and local circumstances we find ourselves in.

As you will see from our annual financials, we are still using reserves to sustain operations. Please add this as an item for prayer and action as we need to become net zero in our use of reserves.

I have been privileged to work along side a Board of Trustees who are committed to A Rocha, participate in the thought leadership and also in practical actions and in addition provide guidance and wisdom to the National Director. Thanks to them. This report will touch on the exciting initiatives in Partnerships, Christians in Conservation, links with churches, and other actions that are happening.

Early on in 2020 I read John Piper's book titled "Coronavirus and Christ". In it he talks about what God is doing through the coronavirus pandemic and some chapters are titled "Realigning Us with the Infinite worth of Christ", "Creating Good Works in Danger"

and "Loosening Roots to Reach the Nations." My prayer is that we will be used by our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in all three of the above headings.

National Director's Report

At the start of 2020 the concepts of lockdown, social distancing, mandatory wearing of masks and the liberal use of hand sanitiser were only slightly more unimaginable than the thought that our most aged generations could ever master Zoom Video Conferencing. On all accounts, the unimaginable became reality. The direct and indirect effects of the Covid 19 pandemic on South Africa have been beyond disruptive with many living through personal tragedy on their own, often isolated from support systems. To this point, and by the grace of God, the people of A Rocha South Africa have largely been spared the tragic effects of the pandemic, and like all of us, have had to adapt to a new reality.

For A Rocha SA this new reality involved the complete loss of opportunity to engage with churches and schools and radically reduced connection with our volunteers on creation care projects. Positively, however, this time gave us opportunity to forge new and valuable partnerships, notably piloting our 'A Rocha Partner Organisation' programme with Phillipskop Mountain Reserve in the Western Cape, entering into an agreement with FreeMe Wildlife KZN to partner on 'The Tortoise Project' and completing an environmental education curriculum for the Kuzuko Foundation in the Eastern Cape. Each of these valuable collaborations position us well in our goal to become a highly credible conservation organisation within South Africa.

The year also saw a change in my personal role as I relinquished my role of Chairman and was appointed part-time National Director of A Rocha South Africa. Not only has this provided me with the opportunity to focus on the operational aspects of the organisation but has also given A Rocha SA a highly skilled, experienced and strategically wise Chairman in David Gertzen. I am grateful to David for taking on this role and for the continued support from the entire board of A Rocha SA. I'm also highly appreciative of the administrative work done by Melanie Rood and value working alongside her.

It would be an understatement to say that 2020 didn't go as planned for A Rocha SA, and that's okay. It's been a reminder of the truth of Proverbs 16:9, *"In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps"* and testimony of our Lord continually guiding us in each step through a difficult year. We trust Him to continue directing our paths.

Church and Community

As a faith-based organisation grounded in the Christian faith, the motivation and ethos of A Rocha South Africa as a biodiversity conservation organisation emerges from a faith perspective. With a well developed biblical theology of creation care we are able to speak the faith language of the majority of South Africans and, from this common starting point, engage hearts and minds to move individuals and communities towards caring for the environment as we guide people towards the biblical mandate to be stewards of God's earth.

Uniquely operating as a biodiversity conservation organisation within the Christian tradition, A Rocha South Africa is strategically equipped to engage with South Africa's largest religious grouping in matters of environmental care and biodiversity conservation.

Opportunities for direct church engagement during 2020 were limited due to the planning constraints experienced amongst local churches. A Rocha South Africa was, however, able to adapt to online engagements. The East Griqualand Action Team made use of WhatsApp groups for weekly creation care updates to team members whilst video conferencing tools were used for various webinars. These



included such events as Anna Whitehouse addressing the Christian Camping International global conference on the topic of biblical creation care, while Murray Tessendorf had opportunities to



address such diverse online events as the Green Anglican Youth for KZN and Eswatini on the topic 'Lockdown Birding' and the Midlands Senior Forum on the topic of 'The Role of Faith Based Organisations in Conservation'.

Biodiversity Conservation Projects and Events

The year saw the development and piloting of the A Rocha Partner Organisation programme with the Phillipskop Mountain Reserve. These 246 hectares of Cape Floral Kingdom splendour situated outside are Hermanus, Western Cape. Owners, Drs Chris and Anna Whitehouse, are committed to caring for, and sharing this special part of God's world with others, in order to engage, educate and encourage people towards caring for God's creation. A Rocha South Africa is excited to partner with Chris and Anna in their endeavour to care for this 246 hectare corner of creation and forward celebrating look to the reserve's extraordinary biodiversity and conservation achievements.



A Rocha Partner Organisations share A Rocha SA's ethos of caring for God's creation and commit themselves to achieve measurable goals in biodiversity conservation, stewardship of natural habitats and sustainable living.



The primary community based projects conducted during 2020 included the KZN Action Team's continued forest rehabilitation within a portion of the Ferncliffe

Nature Reserve (Pietermaritzburg). In this regard, a beneficial and very enjoyable mini bioblitz was conducted prior to lockdown restrictions being implemented.







The Western Cape continued their ongoing work towards the rehabilitation of a portion of the Kuils River. To this end, and despite the challenges presented in conducting volunteer orientated events, the A Rocha affiliated 'Footsteps to Good Hope EcoYouth' conducted two river clean-ups during the year. A further significant development for A Rocha South Africa during 2020 was the entering into an agreement with FreeMe Wildlife KZN on a collaborative project for the rehabilitation and release of captive held tortoise species native to KwaZulu-Natal. FreeMe Wildlife KZN is a world class wildlife rehabilitation facility and the only wildlife rehabilitation facility within South Africa permitted by local wildlife authorities to embark on a tortoise rehabilitation and release programme, subject to stringent rehabilitation protocols.

This collaborative project, formally known as '<u>The Tortoise Project'</u> will focus on the four tortoise species native to KwaZulu-Natal, namely the Leopard Tortoise, Natal Hinged Tortoise, Speke's Hinged Tortoise and Bell's (Eastern) Hinged Tortoise. With current national regulations prohibiting the release of captive held tortoise, including those that may have been removed from the wild, it is hoped that the success of this programme will pave the way for similar rehabilitation and release initiatives in other regions of South Africa and internationally.

A Rocha SA will fulfil a supporting role to FreeMe Wildlife, assisting with the construction and landscaping of rehabilitation enclosures, developing tortoise food gardens and providing assistance towards the long term success of 'The Tortoise Project'.



The Kuzuko A Rocha Memorial Bird Hide





During the early part of 2020 the management and staff of Kuzuko Lodge and a team of highly skilled and motivated volunteers from the area of Nelson Mandela Bay Metro conceived the idea of constructing a bird hide in memory of Chris and Susanna Naylor and Miranda Harris, who lost their

lives in a motor accident in Port Elizabeth during 2019. Furthermore, this project sought to celebrate Peter Harris' ongoing work of championing creation care globally through the work of A Rocha International.

The project began in the first quarter of 2020 and required the excavation of the main pond, a filtration



pond, the construction of a bird hide and final landscaping. Whilst construction work was done on site, a great deal of the carpentry was done in volunteers' homes, the sourcing of supplies made difficult due to lockdown restrictions. Finally, all the pieces could be brought together resulting in a tranquil bird viewing area and hide ideally designed for bird photography.

The Kuzuko A Rocha Memorial Bird Hide was officially opened by Catharina de Lange (Kuzuko

Lodge) and Murray Tessendorf with a ribbon cutting ceremony on 4 September 2020.

A Rocha South Africa would like to thank Gerhard and Catharina de Lange and the staff of Kuzuko

Lodge as well as an amazingly committed and hard working group of volunteers including Keith Joubert, Lesley Joubert, Wentzel Greyling and Martin Keevy.





Environmental Education




A Rocha South Africa made positive strides towards a formal and well structured environmental education programme with the completion of a series of environmental education modules for primary school learners. Importantly, these modules were developed to be in-line with and compliment the South African Department of Education syllabus for life skills and natural science and technology. Developed by Dr Friederike Voigt and made possible through funding from the Kuzuko Foundation these environmental

education modules will be used as а basis for environmental education in resource poor schools initially in the Eastern Cape and KwaZulu-Natal.

EcoYouth

A Rocha EcoYouth are A Rocha SA affiliated independent groups of Christian young people answering the call to care for creation and engaging their considerable energy to do so.



The 'Footsteps to Good Hope EcoYouth' is made up of teens and young adults from the Bellville area of the Western Cape.

These motivated young people have been involved in running a series of diverse events that draw people's attention to the wonders of God's creation and issues of ecological concern.

These events have included numerous river clean-ups of the Kuils River, hikes, photo and colouring competitions, information events, a combined event with the Strandlopers EcoYouth and the distribution of field guide books to resource poor game rangers in the Kalahari.






The Strandlopers EcoYouth is a group of more than 60 children and teens from disadvantaged communities active in the Overberg region of the Western Cape.

During the year this active group participated in 4 cleanups, including those held on International Coastal Cleanup Day and World Wetland Day. Additionally the group were able to attend a talk on local birding and participate in a number of online meetings with regional conservationists.

During the height of the Covid restrictions, the Strandlopers were able to assist with the distribution of food and vegetables within their community.
