#### **National Director's Report**

In considering the work of A Rocha South Africa during 2021, I have been encouraged at how much the A Rocha SA community has achieved during a year in and out of lockdowns and various challenges. During a time when volunteer events have been so difficult to plan in advance due to the uncertainties of the pandemic, we still managed to engage in biodiversity surveys, river clean-ups, nurdle hunts and birding events. Indeed, the number of volunteers attending many of our creation care events have been greater than we've seen in many years.

Our longest running conservation programme in Ferncliffe Nature Reserve now enters its 15th year and we applaud those who had the foresight to begin this restoration project in the very early days of A Rocha in South Africa. What started out as a tree planting exercise today exists as a forest filled with creatures that have made 'our corner of creation' their home. The Tortoise Project, our newest collaborative project, has also begun to bear fruit with the release back into the wild of the first batch of tortoise and the beginning of construction of tortoise rehabilitation enclosures.

The greatest strategic change within the organisation during 2021 came from the realisation that nature conservation in South Africa cannot exist apart from community development. Believing that A Rocha, as a biodiversity conservation organisation with a Christian ethos, is uniquely positioned to work through local community churches, the Board of

A Rocha SA made the decision to investigate opportunities for sustainable livelihood creation amongst resource poor communities in environmentally sensitive areas. In this regard research, planning and concept development has commenced during the year.

I remain highly appreciative of the support and guidance I have received from our chairman, David Gertzen and the Board of A Rocha SA. I am grateful for all the behind the scenes work done by our Administrator, Melanie Rood. I am thankful for the time and effort given freely to A Rocha SA by numerous volunteers. #### **Biodiversity Conservation Projects** Ferncliffe Nature Reserve

A Rocha South Africa has been involved in the restoration of a portion of the Ferncliffe Nature Reserve (Pietermaritzburg, KZN) since 2007. The long term restoration project seeks to return this Eastern Mistbelt Forest back to its former glory through indigenous tree planting and invasive vegetation removal. Volunteer events during 2021 included a midwinter invasive vegetation hack, Arbor Day events, a citizen science biodiversity survey (Bioblitz) and guided walks through the forest. During 2021 A Rocha SA joined involved roleplayers to assess the reserve for the purpose increasing its formally recognised  $of_{-}$ protected status. A process was also begun to enter into a Voluntary Association with role players for the management of Ferncliffe Nature Reserve.



#### **Biodiversity Conservation Projects** The Tortoise Project

A Rocha South Africa, in collaboration with FreeMe Wildlife, has embarked upon 'The Tortoise Project' with the goal of rehabilitating and releasing into the wild the four terrestrial tortoise species found in KwaZulu-Natal. With the approval of provincial wildlife authorities, FreeMe Wildlife has developed a nine month rehabilitation protocol which allows for the rehabilitation and release of the Natal Hinged Tortoise, Speke's Hinged Tortoise and Bell's (Eastern) Hinged Tortoise, with permits for the release of Leopard Tortoise pending. A Rocha SA contributes to this project through the construction of custom built tortoise rehabilitation enclosures and assistance as required. Through generous funding by individuals and the supply of building material at cost price by Build-It Hilton, construction commenced on our first tortoise rehabilitation enclosure. This enclosure, the first of 10 such enclosures, will ultimately allow for up to 400 tortoise to enter into the rehabilitation programme annually. The highlight of the year was participating in the first release of 14 Eastern and Natal Hinged tortoise in Zululand. Continued radio monitoring of the released animals will monitor animal survivability and inform rehabilitation protocols.

#### **Community Based Conservation:** A Rocha Action Teams.

A Rocha Action Teams are local teams of Christians who care for creation as an act of worship and obedience. Action Teams involve themselves with local expressions of creation care through practical environmental projects within their own community. These volunteer groups are currently active in KwaZulu-Natal (East Griqualand and Pietermaritzburg), Gauteng (predominantly Johannesburg) and the Western Cape (Cape Town region). During 2021, Action Team events included a birding outing to Marivale Bird Sanctuary and Melville Koppies Nature Reserve; invasive vegetation clearing and tree planting at Ferncliffe Nature Reserve; 'church in creation' events in East Griqualand; river and beach cleanups (KZN and the Western Cape) and ongoing rehabilitation of a section of the Kuils River in the Western Cape.

A Rocha Action teams bring together people from across denominational lines to work together in caring for God's creation.

### Youth in Conservation A Rocha EcoYouth

A Rocha EcoYouth are A Rocha SA affiliated independent groups of Christian young people answering the call to care for creation and engaging their considerable energy to do so. A Rocha EcoYouth Groups consist of the 'Strandloopers' EcoYouth (Overberg region, Western Cape) and 'Footsteps to Good Hope' EcoYouth (Belville, Western Cape).



With programmes ranging from hands on environmental education, river and beach cleanups and longer term land rehabilitation projects, A Rocha EcoYouth make a positive contribution to the lives of young people and the places in which they live. During 2021, more than 250 youth participated in 5 river and beach cleanup projects in the Western Cape.



### A Rocha Partner Organisation Phillipskop Mountain Reserve

Phillipskop Mountain Reserve, near Stanford in the Western Cape, became a Partner Organisation of A Rocha South Africa during 2020. The 246 hectare reserve is owned and managed by Chris and Anna Whitehouse, who are committed to running the reserve as a conservation area. Phillipskop's conservation achievements included:

- Increased total flora species count to 865 native species.
- Published a monograph on Cliffortia, one of the fynbos's large genera.
- Conducted an invasive plant clearing programme, resulting in the clearing of 8 hectares (ha's) of established Port Jackson Willow, 11 ha's of Hakea, and the removal of 100,000 Port Jackson seedlings from a 13 ha burn area.

# Hounfain reserve

A Rocha Partner Organisations (APO's) share A Rocha SA's ethos of caring for God's creation and commit themselves to achieve measurable goals in biodiversity conservation, stewardship of natural habitats and sustainable living. Partners are encouraged to set annual conservation targets, measure their progress and celebrate conservation achievements.



### **Special Relationships** Kuzuko A Rocha Memorial Bird Hide

The year saw the celebration of the first anniversary of the opening of the Kuzuko A Rocha Memorial Bird Hide. Situated at the Kuzuko Lodge, Greater Addo Area, Eastern Cape, the hide has wracked up a bird list of over 50 species in its first year. In addition to excellent bird photography opportunities, the hide provides a most tranquil environment to sit, watch and relax. During 2021, Kuzuko Lodge hosted two bird ringing (banding) events and an informative presentation on the importance of bird ringing by Dr Mark Brown (A Rocha Board of Reference). A team from Kuzuko also participated in the inaugural John Stott Memorial Birding day, contributing a count of over 130 species identified on the Kuzuko Reserve alone. A Rocha SA appreciates the special relationship we have with the Kuzuko Lodge and Kuzuko Foundation and look forward to future endeavors for the good of people and place.





#### **Church and Community**

As churches begin to emerge from the Covid pandemic, increasing opportunity has allowed A Rocha SA to engage with the local church on numerous levels. This has ranged from creation care themed mens' breakfasts, creation care workshops for the African Enterprise Foxfire Team, engagements with pastors and church leaders in Gauteng and radio interviews on regional and national Christian radio stations.



Uniquely operating as a biodiversity conservation organisation within the Christian tradition, A Rocha South Africa is strategically equipped to engage with South Africa's largest religious grouping in matters of environmental care and biodiversity conservation.

#### Governance

Despite the tumultuous year of Covid uncertainty and the political unrest that has gripped our nation, the Board of Trustees of A Rocha South Africa, continue to exert a stable and positive influence over the governance of our national organisation. This has ensured that, despite the challenges faced, A Rocha SA ended 2021 in a stronger and more stable position. The very positive trend of steady progress within the organisation is in no small part due to the consistency and leadership of our Board of Trustees. During 2021 we celebrated with Christine and Garth on the birth of their first son, Dominic Myles Cuenod, and pray that he will bring his parents a lifetime
